The **Cambridge Antiquarian Society** was founded in 1840 to provide access to local history, architecture and archaeology for local people. Members are

eligible to attend the annual programme of monthly lectures and are entitled to a reduced fee for the society's two annual conferences. Members receive a copy of the Society's journal, *Proceedings of the Cambridge Antiquarian Society*, and a copy of *Conduit*, which lists lecture programmes, local societies and events in the county each year.

Membership benefits include:

Lecture programme

- Early evening lectures once each month from October to June.
- Speakers are usually well-known scholars and local experts.
- Accessible central Cambridge venue with plentiful free car parking.
- Excursions led by experts.

Conferences

- All-day spring conference in central Cambridge.
- Autumn exhibition and conference centred on recent archaeological work in the county.

Publications

- *Proceedings of the Cambridge Antiquarian Society* published annually with a national reputation for excellence.
- *The Conduit*: bulletin detailing local historical and archaeological activities by local societies and museums in Cambridgeshire.

Collections

- Access to the *University Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology*.
- Access to *Department of Archaeology Haddon Library*.
- *Cambridgeshire Collection*, Central Library, Lion Yard houses over 8,000 CAS photographs of the county.
- *County Record Office* holds nearly 3,000 CAS lantern slides of Cambridgeshire.
- *The Cambridge University Library* keeps the early 19th century Relhan Collection of over 350 watercolours of Cambridgeshire, and an extensive collection of rubbings of monumental brasses.

Local responsibilities

- Comments on proposals by the Local Authorities.
- Represents the interest of local history, archaeology and architecture within the county.
- Is included in local bodies such as the Archives Advisory Panel.
- Cambridgeshire representative for the Council for British Archaeology.
- Comments on listed buildings applications.
